Towards Universal Implementation of the ICC Statute

Peace and Justice Initiative (PJI) Fellowship in International Criminal Law (conditions)

The fellowship is the opportunity for PJI to participate in assisting an individual to enhance their skills in the field of international criminal law and to support the implementation of international criminal law at the international courts and in domestic jurisdictions. The fellowship shall be implemented in accordance with the following conditions:

- The fellowship will be for a duration of 6 months and will involve the funding sufficient to carry out the internship or project to a maximum of 12,000 euros. The duration or quantum of the fellowship may be varied at the agreement of PJI and the fellow.
- The fellow will be required to not undertake any actions or engage in any conduct that would undermine or run contrary to the stated goals of PJI.
- The fellow will bear all tax liabilities, such as should arise, in connection with this fellowship and agrees to indemnify PJI from any such tax liabilities without reservation. The fellow shall have no right of action against PJI for any finances that are not forthcoming in connection with this fellowship.
- The fellow will be responsible for ensuring their lawful presence in the country in which they carry out their internship or project. PJI is not in a position to provide any form of visa or residency assistance to the fellow.
- The fellow will be expected to adhere to all the relevant regulations at the institution at which he or she is placed, including attendance at work.
- The fellow will be expected to provide a written, and, if practicable, oral, report on their work at the institution during or at the conclusion of their fellowship.
- PJI will retain the capacity to withdraw its participation in the fellowship program with reasonable warning.
